Introduction

SIKKIM DIVYANG SAHAYATA SAMITI is a Non-Governmental Organization formed in the year 1999 and formally registered on 29.01.2001 by Law Department, Government of Sikkim vide sl. No. 1168 Vol. No I in accordance with the notification No. 2602 A/H dated 25.03.1960. Since the inception, SVSS has been working selflessly for the welfare of the Divyang People in the State of Sikkim. We provide Artificial Limbs, Wheel Chairs and Crutches for which we have trained technicians. We conduct Skill Development Training for their livelihood (like Computer Training, Khada Making, Beautician Training, Bamboo Crafts etc.) in collaboration with Government and other NGO's of India.

We also do Cleft Palate Surgeries yearly with the help of Dr. Satya Saraswat (Plastic & Cosmetic Surgeon of Saraswat Hospital. Agra) supported by local Doctors and Staff of Sikkim Health Department.

We have also started the construction of 'Rehabilitation Centre' for the Divyang People at Reshap, Tokal Bermiok, South Sikkim for which we are raising funds and we hope to complete the construction soon for which we need support from one and all..

SIKKIM DIVYANG SAHAYATA SAMITI is also granted registration u/s 12AA with sub section (a) of 12A of the Income Tax Act 1961 with effect from 01.04.2012 and is also qualified for deduction u/s 80G(5)(vi) of the Income Tax Act 1961.

Lastly, nothing is possible without the help from the Government and our Well Wishers (like Hon'ble Chief Minister of Sikkim Shri.P. S. Tamang (Golay), various Esteemed Government Departments of the Sikkim, Private Companies etc.)

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ACTIVITIES



Field workers and Community Based Rehabilitation (CBR) workers under the project Sparsh Deafblind from Sikkim Divyang Sahayata Samiti (SDSS) participated in a regional network meeting organized by the Deafblind Regional Centre (DbRC) ShishuSarothi with support from Sense International India, in Guwahati, Assam from 27th to 29thSeptember, 2021.



It was attended by persons with deafblindness, parents, and special educators from the states of Assam, Meghalaya, Sikkim, and Tripura. The three-day meet included discussions related to the empowerment of persons with deafblindness. Around 50 participant members attended the regional meet, comprising members from the Udaan Network of Adults with Deafblindness, the Prayaas Network of Parents, the AbhiPrerna Network of Special Educators, and the family members of children with deafblindness. Adults with deafblindness discussed the challenges they faced due to the Covid-19 pandemic ranging from issues related to healthcare, difficulties in communication, lack of accessible information about Coronavirus, financial constraints, and barriers in accessing online education among other issues.

Ketaki Bardalai, the Executive Director of ShishuSarothi remarked that ShishuSarothi had been working extensively in awareness-raising, legal counselling, litigation services, and that we need to raise our voices at different levels and look for opportunities to strengthen the network of

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young adults with deafblindness and their caregivers. The team at ShishuSarothi has also been building the capacity of the northeast region and increasing their reach through the training conducted by the Sparsh Program of Deafblind Resource Centre which started in 2015. Akhil Paul, founder and director of Sense International India (SII), extended his wishes to everyone and emphasized the need to work towards building a future for children with deafblindness and to be aware of all the policies and strategies for supporting them.



Government officials from various departments including Debeshwar Borah (State Commissioner for the Persons with Disabilities) and Ram Kishore Sharma (Assistant Director, Employment of the National Career Service Centre for Differently-Abled) were also present.

Borah commented on the challenges faced by persons with disabilities and talked about the need to establish a joint venture by the institution with other organizations. Stressing on the need for a strong network for persons with deafblindness, Sharma said, "Our team at the National Career Service Centre for Differently Abled, Guwahati, provides support through scholarships and certificates and develop their expertise and train them in specific areas based on their skill sets."

The three-day training involved discussions on issues related to understanding the rights of persons with deafblindness, roles and responsibilities of regional local networks, and ways to strengthen the network. Adults with deafblindness also gained hands-on experience through their exposure visit to Vocational Rehabilitation Centre, Guwahati. SDSS, as a partner of SII, represented the state of Sikkim at the meet and participated in the training.

6th Sikkim Run 2021





The sixth edition of the Sikkim state run happened on 31st October 2021, organised by the Office of the Chief Electoral Officer, Sikkim. The event was in collaboration with Service to Mankind Group (a local NGO) and its theme was "No voter to be left Behind". Many of the staff and people with disabilities associated with Sikkim Divyang Sahayata Samiti (SDSS) participated in the run. Apart from that, more than 400 runners had participated in

the marathon included runners from all Sikkim, over Darjeeling, Kurseong, Uttarakhand, Uttar Pradesh, Maharashtra, Goa, Kolkata, Mumbai, West Bengal, Madhya Pradesh and Nepal. A.P Justice Subba, Chairperson, Law



Commission and Lokayukta, graced the event as the Chief Guest, in the presence of Ms. Pema Laden Lama (Joint CEO), Mr. Kiran Rasaily (Retired Secretary) and Padma Shree awardee, Ms. Draupadi Ghimiray (State Icon and founder of SDSS).

During her speech, Ms. Pema Laden Lama (Joint CEO), informed the gathering about the various activities which would be undertaken during the Special Summary Revision 2022 starting from 1st Nov 2021 to 30th Nov 2021. She urged all the new, eligible voters to register themselves. Lastly, the winners and participants of the marathon were felicitated with cash prizes

and medals during the award distribution ceremony by the Chief Guest. The event was a grand success with participants informing the media that they would be looking forward to such events in the future.



One Day Training on Accessible Elections

Sikkim Divyang Sahayata Samiti (SDSS) organised a one-day training program on 'Accessible Elections for Persons with Disabilities (PwDs)' was held on 08.10.21 as an initiative by the Office of the Chief Electoral Officer,



Sikkim. The training aimed for the proper functioning of Electoral Rolls and the facilitation of accessible elections for the local persons with disabilities of Sikkim. Ms. Pema Laden Lama (Joint CEO) of the Office of the Chief Electoral Officer, Sikkim talked about the PwD voter app which allows PwDs to fill all forms related to the summary revision of electoral rolls. Ms. Lama emphasised that they want to act in line with the inclusive initiatives taken by the Election Commission of India and build a partnership with PwDs of Sikkim. She believes that the PwDs involved in this training will further take the message forward to their communities and help generate awareness about the same, this way no voter would be left behind. 18-year-old Mr Bimal Subba, associated with SDSS, was the first PwDb voter to get registered.

Ms. Draupadi Ghimiray (Founder, SDSS, Padmashree Awardee) talked about the work SDSS as done in the field of disability and how it has had door to door services to reach PwDs living in the remotest areas of Sikkim. Mr. Ramesh Periwal (Working President of finance, SDSS)

mentioned in his speech that SDSS has recommended ways to make elections in Sikkim more accessible. One active suggestion by SDSS for the same was to make accessible voting booths specifically for PwDs in various towns of Sikkim like Gangtok, Singtam, Jorethang, etc. so it becomes easier for the local PwDs to access them. The Office of the Chief Electoral Officer, Sikkim has put forward these suggestions to the Election Commission of India in New Delhi.



Mr. Periwal has been associated with SDSS for 22 years, is one of its founding members and has been working with other NGOs as well. During the Covid-19 pandemic too, Mr. Periwal worked to make medical aid accessible to all PwDs in Sikkim. For his humanitarian efforts, with a recommendation from SDSS, Mr. Periwal has been conferred with an Honorary Doctorate by the World Human Rights Protection Commission (WHRPC) of India in New Delhi on 26th September 2021.



Sikkim State Level Online Sensitisation Training on Deafblindness for Medical and Paramedical Professionals

Sikkim Divyang Sahayata Samiti (SDSS), supported by Sense International India (SII), Ahmedabad and funded by the H. T. Parekh Foundation, organized a Sikkim State Level Online Sensitisation Training of Deafblindness at Central Referral Hospital, Sikkim Manipal University on 2nd November 2021. Medical and paramedical professionals, government officials and health and rehabilitation professionals from SDSS were amongst the many participants in this online training session. The session was conducted by SII's Training Head, Ms. Rosa Wahlang and the Head of Capacity Building, Mr. Sachin Rizal.



Background: Deafblindness is a condition in which a person may have a combination of hearing and visual impairments causing severe communication, developmental, psycho-social, emotional and educational needs. Children with Deafblindness (CwDb) also tend to have a wide range of other associated conditions such as learning difficulties, epilepsy, feeding problems, and other severe disabilities. In India, there are close to 780,000 People with Deafblindness (PwDb) who are most often overlooked by society.



Sense International India (SII), founded in 1997, is the first and only national level NGO that is dedicated towards working with PwDb throughout India by partnering with likeminded organizations that work with PwDb and other PwDs. As of date, SII has reached to over 78,000 PwDbs through 60 partners in 23 states of the country. It is evident that there are not many organizations that provide need-based services such as education, health, rehabilitation, and vocational training to PwDb. There is also a lack of awareness around deafblindness among the community, general public, policy-makers, development planners, and NGOs. Public Health systems at present are also not adequately equipped to identify and diagnose children who are at risk of deafblindness.



Sikkim Divyang Sahayata Samiti (SDSS) is a non-profit, secular, registered, charitable society established at Zero Point, Gangtok, Sikkim, India in 1999. The organization started under the inspiring leadership and vision of Ms. Droupadi Ghimiray (Padma Shree). SDSS works towards forming partnerships with people, communities, and resources so as to create opportunities which empower, enhance dignity, include, and lead to the security of health, nutrition, livelihoods and shelter in a sustainable manner. SDSS works with people in vulnerable situations especially PwDs, children, youth, and women living in extreme poverty, particularly those residing in remote rural areas. Sikkim Divyang Sahayata Samiti's strategy is to organize programs around disability which are inclusive, barrier free, and rights based, while using the Community Based Rehabilitation (CBR) approach. SDSS's main goal is to increase accessibility of PwDs so they can create sustainable livelihoods, especially among rural communities. SDSS does so through the application of appropriate technologies, promotion of micro-enterprises and an attitude of stewardship towards the earth, and finally by creating and joining networks for greater impact.





Therefore, the Sikkim State Level Online Sensitization Training of Deafblindness aimed to initiate services which included understanding deafblindness, sensory integration dysfunction and management of Children with Deafblindness' (CwDb) Needs of Early identification, screening and intervention of CwDb in Sikkim so that maximum children with deafblindness and multiple disabilities have access to Early Childhood Care and Education (ECCE). There is a strong consensus

among special educators and professionals who work in the field of Deafblindness that Early Identification and Intervention is a crucial factor in maximizing the potential for growth and development of CwDb. It can also increase the support provided to families and caregivers. It has been stated that to achieve this goal, a partnership needs to be developed between the child, the family, the professionals and other support networks.

Further, it has been identified that since around 70% of the total population of India resides in rural areas, the majority of children with disabilities are also found in rural areas due to lack of proper medical services or other reasons. Hence, the involvement of medical and paramedical professionals is of utmost importance for the formation of partnerships to promote initiatives aligned with Government priorities under the National Health Mission.

To achieve these aims and objectives through the online training, SDSS made prolific use of presentations, case studies, theoretical inputs and various audio-visual techniques as the methodology. In the end, via the virtual training, SDSS estimated to have created a collaboration of NGOs and the Government sector in providing services to children with deafblindness and multiple disabilities. It also aimed to increase the referrals of CwDb to the service provider and to generate greater awareness about CwDb and multiple disabilities in the community, health centres, the National Health Mission, hospitals and clinics.

International Day of PwD 2021



On 3rd December 2021, Sikkim Divyang Sahayata Samiti (SDSS), in collaboration with the Women and Child Development Department of Sikkim, organised the celebration of International Day of Persons with Disabilities (PwD) in its new Multipurpose Rehabilitation Centre at Bermiok, South Sikkim. Honourable Chief Minister of Sikkim, Mr. Prem Singh Tamang graced the occasion with his presence as the chief guest of the event. Mr. Tamang was accompanied by the Minister of Health and Family Welfare, Social Welfare and Women and Child Development Department, Dr. M. K. Sharma, the Minister of Education Department, Mr. Kunga Nima Lepcha and the Minister of Tourism Department cum Area MLA, Mr. Bedu Singh Panth along with other dignitaries.



Honourable Chief Minister inaugurated the special school called 'Divya Nirman Kendra' located in the premises of the SDSS multipurpose rehabilitation centre. The school was established in the memory of Lt. Khajanchiram Agarwal by the Nirmala Devi Foundation, Singtam. The program began with an obituary and two minutes of silence for late Tashi

Densapa who was also known as the Bermiok Pimpoche. Remembered for his philanthropic activities, Tashi Densapa had also donated 4.5 acres of land to SDSS for the construction of this centre.



Addressing the public gathering, Honourable Chief Minister extended his warm wishes to everyone on the occasion of International Day of Persons with Disabilities. In his speech the CM talked about promoting the rights of PwDs and to stand with them in facing all odds. Further, he added that the state government shall move forward and provide equitable opportunities to one and all. He then announced that for the welfare of the PwD community, the state shall provide ad-hoc employment to people whose parents are both PwDs. The rehabilitation centre was also decided to be named as the 'Late Tashi Densapa Multipurpose Rehabilitation Centre'. The minister also assured to look into the basic provision for facilitating in making the environment of government offices and the bazaar areas more accessible to PwDs.



Finally, Secretary SJ&WD Tshewang Gyacho highlighted the schemes and policies adopted by the state government to cater for the welfare of persons with different types of disabilities. SDSS members Ms Purnima Sharma, Dr Savitri Hamal, Dr Pempa Tshering Bhutia, Dr Shashi Pradhan, Dr Sarita Gurung, Shri Kamlesh Agarwal, and Ms Shanti Ghimirey were facilitated by the Chief Minister along with awarding cash rewards for marriage with PwDs under the social justice and welfare department.

The Chief Minister also distributed certificates of Indus Tower scholarship, in partnership with SDSS to 10 PwDs students for their higher education.





As a part of the International Day of PwDs celebration, SDSS also organized Sikkim's first Divyangjan Assembly. For the very first time, a large gathering of people with disabilities interacted with the Honourable Chief Minister of Sikkim, Shri. Prem Singh Tamang and the Education Minister of Sikkim, Shri Kunga Nima Lepcha, without the presence

of any VIPs. A total of thirty-six persons with disabilities represented the PwDs of Sikkim from all walks of life and voiced their concerns in the form of short speeches around varied issues. Then the Chief Minister took note of all the issues raised by the PwDs and acknowledged their applications. He claimed that he would work on all their issues and leave no one behind in this fight for a more just and accessible environment for all.



Scholarship For Higher Studies



This year, Sikkim Divyang Sahayata Samiti with the support of Shishu Sarothi assisted 10 PwD students to get Indus Towers scholarships in which a student can choose any kind of course and the fee will be paid by Indus Towers. Certificates of Scholarships were distributed on the occasion of International Day for PwDs by Honourable Chief Minister of Sikkim Shri Prem Singh Tamang.

EXECUTIVE MEETINGS 2021-22



Executive Meeting on 18TH October 2021



An executive meeting was held at the office of Sikkim Divyang Sahayata Samiti, located in Gangtok. The meeting was chaired by the President of the organization, Ms Draupadi Ghimiray (Padma Shri). Other executive members who were present at this meeting included Dr Bina Basnet (Working President of Administration), Dr Ramesh Periwal (Working President of Finance), Ms Bishnu Kumari Rai (Vice President), Mr Suren Rai (Joint Secretary).

The main agenda of the meeting was to appoint an assistant for Mr Khillan Tamang who is the technician for SDSS. The appointed person would assist Mr Tamang in the limb making workshop as well as in the office. The new assistant would undergo a training period of three months and would only be offered a permanent position according to their performance. The discussion then shifted to the work and routine followed by the field workers under the Sense International India project. Finally, the resignation of SDSS' special educator, Mr Daulat Ram Singh was also accepted in this meeting due to his continued ill health.

Executive Meeting on 16TH November 2021

An executive meeting was held at the office of Sikkim Divyang Sahayata Samiti, located in Gangtok. The meeting was chaired by the President of the organization, Ms Draupadi Ghimiray (Padma Shri). Other executive members who were present at this meeting included Dr Ramesh Periwal (Working President of Finance), Ms Bishnu Kumari Rai (Vice President), Ms Sunita Serohia (Joint Secretary), Mr Navraj Tiwari (the then General Secretary), Ms Shobhana Sarda, and Ms Puja Tiwari.

The primary agendas discussed in this meeting revolved around staffing issues concerning a Community Based Rehabilitation (CBR) worker, offering condolences to the Late TashiDensapa's loved ones, and the disposal of SDSS owned land in Sichey. Since a CBR worker had resigned from his post at SDSS due to a lack of discipline, a new CBR worker was recruited in his place. She was assigned work with Mr Bikash Ghimiray with additional responsibilities along with their regular duties and it was also decided to increase their allowances. Condolences were to be uploaded on SDSS' Facebook page in honour of the Late TashiDensapa who had been a long-time patron of SDSS. A visit to his residence to offer condolences after lifting of the quarantine was also fixed at the meeting. Finally, the members at the meeting also decided to dispose of the land SDSS owned at Sichey. Responsibility for the same was assigned to Dr Ramesh and Ms Bishnu who would finalise the paperwork and other legal requirements to discard the land in a proper manner.

Another significant issue at this meeting was a discussion around certain points related to the inauguration ceremony at the International Day of PwDs which was to be held on the 3rd of December, 2021.

Ms Bihnu and Dr Ramesh stepped up undertake the responsibility to visit the concerned departments for the repair of road and power supply at the MPRC where the event was the be held. They also decided that they would forward the request to move the poles' position at the ceremony to the centre since they could be a potential hazard at the event in their previous position. The main events held at the programme were discussed comprising the opening of the Special School by the Chief Minister, Sikkim's first Divyangjan Assembly with an interaction between PwDs and the CM, and a cultural show including a skit and a song by the PwDs.

The arrangements for the food and accommodation at the programme were also discussed and it was decided that the dining place for VIPs and other invitees is to be arranged at the rooftop where Mr Babulal would be providing free of cost meals to around 200 people. Further, Ms Bishnu and Miss Sunita took on the task of meeting and sending applications to organizations like the Singtam Marwari Seva Samiti, the Bihari Samiti, and the Nepali Samiti to discuss the provision of accommodation.

Deliberations around media coverage, transportation, and felicitation were also held at the meeting. Mr Navraj and Ms Sunita decided to send letters to various media houses inviting them to cover the event. An effort to engage national media houses like AIR and Doordarshan for wider coverage of the event was also discussed. For the transportation, discussions were to be held with the social welfare department and a request for the bus service was to be made to the SNT. All members of SDSS since its inception were to be felicitated at this event. A granite engraving on the establishing stone of the to be inaugurated school was to be made and certain photos chosen by Ms Draupadi Ghimiray were to be framed for the occasion from either a local vendor or Siliguri. This concluded the executive meeting held at the SDSS office on 16th November 2021.



Executive Meeting At MPRC on 4th January

An executive body meeting was held at MPRC, Bermiok, South Sikkim on 4th January, 2022. The meeting was chaired by the President of the organization, Ms Draupadi Ghimiray (Padma Shri). Other executive members who were present at this meeting included Dr Bina Basnet (Working President of Administration), Dr. Ramesh Periwal (Working President of Finance), Ms Bishnu Kumari Rai (Vice President), Mr Navraj Tiwari (the then General Secretary), Dr. Dinesh Chettri and Ms Shanti Ghimiray (MPRC In charge and member).

The project on deafblindness called 'Sparsh' was deliberated upon by the members and it was decided that SDSS would continue working with Sense International India for the project on deafblindness. The meeting also resolved to increase the salary of SDSS staff from the following months and a vote of thanks by Dr Periwal finally concluded the session.



Executive Meeting on 10th February 2022

An executive meeting was held at the office of Sikkim Divyang Sahayata Samiti, located in Gangtok. The meeting was chaired by the President of the organization, Ms Draupadi Ghimiray (Padma Shri). Other executive members who were present at this meeting included Dr Bina Basnet (Working President of Administration), Dr Ramesh Periwal (Working President of Finance), Ms Bishnu Kumari Rai (Vice President), Mr Kessang D. Lama (Treasurer), Ms Ambika Chettri (Treasurer) and Mr N. T. Loksum (Joint Secretary).

This meeting discussed whether to continue the membership of Bhakti Maya, the centre assistant for Sense International India. The hike in salary of SDSS staff members was finalised and a bonus of Rs 10,000 was to be given to all SDSS staff. Other budgeting decisions included the sum of money to be taken out for the construction work at the MPRC in Bermiok, South Sikkim. There were discussions about Nikita Mangar, an 8 years old resident of Khanisirbong, West Sikkim with orthopaedic disability due to which she required shelter for rehabilitation. Streifeneder, Gurugram, agreed to make prosthetic limbs for Nikita free of cost. Senior technician, Mr Khillan Tamang would also be visiting SHWE, Gurugram for further training in prosthetic limb making so SDSS needed to arrange for his food and lodging during his training. Moreover, two persons including one with deafblindness would be sent to Jaipur for training in artificial limb making.



Executive Meeting on 23rd March 2022

An executive meeting was held at the office of Sikkim Divyang Sahayata Samiti, located in Gangtok. The meeting was chaired by the President of the organization, Ms Draupadi Ghimiray (Padma Shri). Other executive members who were present at this meeting included Dr Savitri Hamal (Board of Director), Dr Ramesh Periwal (Working President of Finance), Ms Bishnu Kumari Rai (Vice President), and Mr Choda Bhutia (General Secretary).

A number of resolutions were passed in this executive meeting. Firstly, master Sangit Bhujel, a resident of the MPRC, was enrolled at Sai Gurukul Academy, Lumsey, Tadong in 6th standard. Then, Shri Choda Bhutia, retired additional secretary of the Law Department, Government of Sikkim, was elected as the new General Secretary of Sikkim Divyang Sahayata Samiti. It was also decided that Ms Nikita Manger, who has an orthopaedic handicap will be proceeding to the Society for Human Welfare and Empowerment, Gurugram for the fitting of her prosthetic limbs. She would be accompanied by her father, Mr Raj Manger and escorted by Mr Khilan Tamang, the senior technician with SDSS.

Further, Mr Khilan Tamang has been deputed to go for higher training on the making of artificial limbs at the Society for Human Welfare and Empowerment, Gurugram for two months. He has been given a travel allowance of Rs 5000 for the same. Since Mr Khillan would be in Gurugram for training, Ms Bhaktimaya Gurung was appointed as a temporary staff at SDSS for the months of March and April. Finally, recruitment of Mr Pranesh Subba as the assistant technician with SDSS starting from 1st April was also discussed.

This year huge amount of people with disabilities visited the office of Sikkim Divyang Sahayata Samiti to take new or to repair their existing assistive devices/prosthetic limbs.
